NPH Outcomes 2016

21 families moved into permanent housing

4 attended college at NPH
10 attended college in Aftercare

18 increased education at NPH
14 increased education in Aftercare

8 women opened banking accounts at NPH
18 have banking accounts in AfterCare

12 gained employment at NPH
13 were employed in AfterCare

16 mothers gained custody at NPH
17 mothers have custody

15 mothers increased child visits toward custody
17 mothers have custody in AfterCare

20 had mental health assessments at NPH

34 mothers and 2 children received counseling at NPH
10 mothers and 4 children received counseling in AfterCare

35 mothers and 26 children were served at NPHA
21 mothers and 21 children were served in AfterCare

Increased Recovery, Relapse Prevention and Dialectical Behavioral Therapy Added. Prepared for Treatment Implementation in 2017.

Purchased 716 MLK House. Will House Vocational Services.

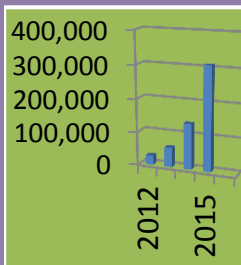
Added Domestic Violence/Sexual Trauma Advocate Services, a Facility Manager, and an Administrative Assistant.

Completed Feasibility Study for New Facility and Began to Meet With Possible Partners and Investigate Sites.



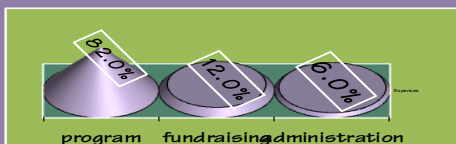
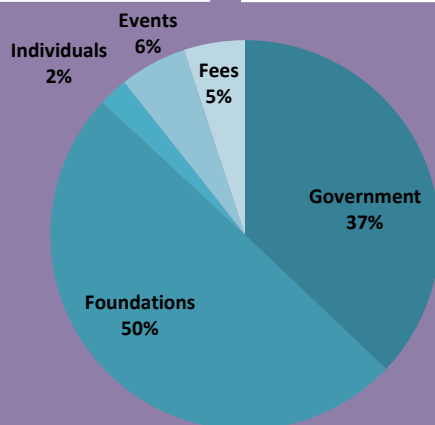
Net Assets
